Fourth Grade Reading Requirements 2024


- Read 6-8 chapter books over the summer. Students may also read some

 prepare for fourth grade. Be sure to include some non-fiction books
- RECORD ALL BOOKS READ ON THE SUMMER READING LOG
- Try to complete the "Summer Reading Bingo" Sheet for some fun reading ideas

ACTIVITIES

- Pick 3 books over the summer to complete 3 of the "I Read..." activity sheets (attached). Be sure to have students write their names and the names of each book on each sheet. Use one per book.
- Pick 3 books over the summer to complete 3 of the "Summarize" sheets. (attached) Complete one per book.

• Accrue 20 AR Points before the first day of school!
