

Sixth Grade Reading Requirements 2024

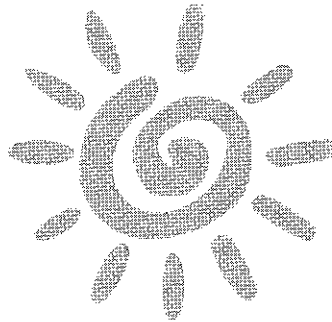
- Read 6-8 chapter books over the summer. Students may also read some picture books and some newspaper or magazine articles. All students should be reading chapter books this summer and only 1-2 may be graphic novels. Be sure to include some non-fiction books
- **RECORD ALL BOOKS READ ON THE SUMMER READING LOG**

ACTIVITIES

- Pick 5 books over the summer to complete 5 of the Writing Prompts (1 per book) on the "Summer Reading Writing Prompt Page" (attached) Use one page per book.

OR

- Accrue 25 AR Points before the first day of school!



Reading Log and Activity Packets (stapled together) are due the first week of school OR students will turn in Reading Log and have earned at least 25 AR Points by the first day of school.

Which character is most like you? Explain.

Make a text to text connection to the story.

Make a text to self connection to the story.

Make a text to world connection to the story.

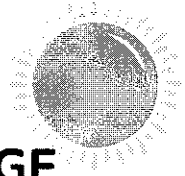
Would this story still make sense if it were set in a different time period? Explain.
