 - To ensure continuity of services, St. Peter School will use guidance from above mentioned authorities and communicate closely with parents and diocesan officials to make sure our school community has all the resources necessary..

a.	Universal and correct wearing of masks;	Masks will be optional for students at St. Peter School. This decision will be left to parents and all choices will be respected.
		Masks may be required for a designated amount of time up to five days if and when any teacher, staff or student returns to school after testing positive for COVID and symptoms have subsided.
		Masks may be required for up to five days if and when student or teacher or staff member has been exposed to COVID.
		St. Peter School will continue to communicate with the Education Office of the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown and families, teachers and staff as developments occur.
b.	Modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);	St. Peter School is operating as a full "in person" institution. Online learning will only be considered if and when a student experiences extreme long absences from school due to COVID or any serious immunity issues. This will be decided in conjunction with the families and school administration.
		Teachers will be encouraged to continue to use outdoor spaces as an option.
		Other protocols could be implemented as warranted.
C.	Handwashing and respiratory etiquette;	We will continue with our hand-washing policies. Students will wash their hands upon entering the school, before and after lunch as well as various other times throughout the day.
d.	facilities, including improving ventilation;	Classrooms will be cleaned and disinfected daily using appropriate safe cleaning agents. Air cleaning devices and AC units will be installed to improve air quality and safety.
e.	Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	As of the writing of this plan, St. Peter School will not do contact tracing in classrooms in the event of a positive COVID case. Parents will be notified of exposure issues as necessary.

	If there is a positive case in the household, the school is to be notified, parents are to monitor the student's symptoms and the student may be required to wear a mask for up to 5 days.
	If a student or teacher or staff tests positive for COVID, they are to remain home for 5 days from the onset of symptoms. On Day 6, if symptoms have resolved and there is no fever for 24 hours without medication, he or she may return to school and may be asked to mask to complete the 10 days
f. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing;	Student families and all staff will monitor for COVID-19 health symptoms in themselves and their families and take all necessary precautions.
g. Efforts to provide <u>vaccinations to school</u> <u>communities</u> ;	As before, St. Peter School will inform school families and faculty of any vaccination opportunities or other vaccine information.
h. Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	Should a child or a child's family have a serious health issue, reasonable accommodations in health and safety policies will be discussed and provided with the consultation with the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown.
Coordination with state and local health officials.	St. Peter School will coordinate with state and local officials through the Education Office of the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown Diocese.
